

## CLASSROOM QUESTIONS - APRIL 2022

## **Reading Comprehension**

- 1. Teen author Olivia Amiri tells us that of the many books she's read recently, *The Overstory* was her favorite. She says it had a profound affect on her and changed her way of thinking. Ask students to think of a book they've read that had a big impact on them and to write a paragraph giving details about it.
- 2. The lesson in the book *Those Kids from Fawn Creek* is: be kind and don't put labels on others or on yourself. Define "labels" and discuss this message with students. Ask them to write a few sentences explaining why they think it's an important one.
- 3. Children's book author and illustrator Wednesday Kirwan says there's always room for creativity and imagination in everything you do. Ask students what they think she means by this and have them write about a specific situation (playing, writing, etc.) when they used their imagination.
- 4. Teen author Taylor Moxey tells readers: Don't compare yourself to others, focus on your own gift, and hit the "reset button" when you need to. Ask students to write a few sentences describing what they think she means by these messages.
- 5. In the story *The Legend of Lop-Eared Larry*, the rabbit learns that his differences can be his strengths. Discuss this idea with students. Ask them to think of and to write about something special about themselves that makes them different from others. Are there ways it might be a strength for them?
