Reading Comprehension

- 1. Ruffles and the New Green Thing is about getting yourself to try new foods. Ask students if they like different types of food. Do they often try a new type of food or are they interested in trying something new? Have them write about an experience with a new food item. What was it and what did they think after trying it?
- 2. In Conrad's Classroom, we learn about butterfly mouth parts. They don't have an actual mouth or tongue, they have a proboscis which they use to sip nectar and to drink water and juice from rotting fruit and minerals from small puddles. Ask kids to write a paragraph that includes other fascinating information about butterflies.
- 3. What's My Amplitide and What's My Frequency are board books that teach wave science concepts in a fun and innovative way. Ask students if they have an interest in science or would like to pursue a career in science. Have them write a few sentence giving details for their answer.
- 4. *In The Together Tree*, Rumi is bullied at his new school because he looks different, until a quiet boy stands up to the kids who are bullying him. Discuss the topic of bullying with students. Ask them to write about what they would do if they saw someone being bullied.
- 5. In *Big Cat, Little Fox*, Big Cat tries to be like other animals, but learns that she must be herself if she is to be her best. The message is about uniqueness and being yourself. Discuss this idea with students. Ask them why they think being yourself is important and to write about what makes them unique and special.
