





Reading Comprehension

- 1. Teen author Olivia Amiri discusses a dilemma she had when learning that her friend vapes. Discuss vaping with students and the harm that it can do. Ask them to write a few sentences detailing what they think about vaping and to include some of the ways they think it can affect them.
- 2. Marky the Magnificent Fairy, a story about a woodland fairy with one small wing who is teased by the other woodland creatures, teaches about diversity, inclusion, kindness, and believing in yourself. We all have unique characteristics that make us magnificent. Ask students to write about what makes them unique and special.
- 3. Bibi's Got Game is a story about a Canadian tennis star who worked hard and followed her dreams despite an injury setback. Ask students to think of something they want to accomplish and to write about what it might take to achieve that goal.
- 4. From A to Z with Energy! is a guide to get kids to move, learn, and use their imagination. It offers 26 ways to move and play. Ask kids what portion of their day they spend playing video games or using their phones versus playing outdoors or using their imaginations to play. Have them write about their "play" selections.
- 5. The author of *My Tiny Pet Elephant* thinks you would enjoy having an elephant as a pet. Ask students if they have any pets. Is there a particular pet that they would want to have some day? Have them describe in a few sentences the pet they'd like to have, what they would name it, and the interactions they'd have with it.
